I saw some very interesting pieces at the County Fair that had used lace as a background... which I thought was pretty unique and absolutely beautiful. Then when I was looking for an idea of what to write about for this month's Education article, I found an old article that gave some hints on "how to tole paint lace" and thought others might enjoy learning this very cool technique as well.

#### Things you will need:

Scrap piece of lace

Spray adhesive

Spray paint

#### Steps to follow:

Prepare the surface of the object that you plan to paint; clean off any dirt or dust and allow it to dry thoroughly before proceeding.

Spray an even coat of adhesive across the surface of the object. Place a piece of lace on top and press down firmly to ensure there are no gaps between the lace and the surface of your piece.

Spray a light, even coat of spray paint onto the lace. Use light, slow strokes and repeat the process until the lace appears to be thoroughly and evenly covered with paint.

Remove the lace immediately after painting it. Start from one corner and pull it up quickly as if ripping off a bandage. You will see the lace pattern revealed after the lace is lifted away.

Use this technique as a base and then continue on with whatever other images you want to paint on top of the lace background.

Holiday Raffle 2018


